Spokesman of Kwara State Fire Service, Mr Hassan Adekunle, who confirmed the incident in a statement. said: "On Monday, January 15, 2024, around 14:46 hours, the Kwara State

Fire Service responded to a fire outbreak the 20 individuals on board. along Oko-Olowo-Jebba expressway in Ilorin, Kwara State

The incident involved a petrol tanker (45,000 litres of PMS), a truck loaded (45,000 litres of PMS), a wuck with soft drinks and a truck loaded with killed in

The fire originated from a head-on Anambra accident collision between the petrol tanker, whose driver lost control, and the truck carrying soybeans. Three lives were lost and eight injuries were recorded among

"Despite the severity of the situation, the firemen successfully contained the fire, preserving the hospital and nearby

Also, yesterday, the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), confirmed that three persons were burnt beyond

recognition in Anambra when their vehicle went into flames along Ezinano-Nkwn on Agulu road in Anaocha Local Government Area.

Mr Adeoye Irelewuyi, Sector Commander, FRSC in Anambra, told newsmen that the incident which was caused by ever speeding and wrongful overtaking occurred on Sunday night.

Seven persons, comprising four males and three females, were involved: threewere killed while two were injured The bodies of the deceased were taken to a nearby mortuary in the area," he said.

While condoling with the families of the dead, the sector commander cautioned motorists against exceeding speed limits and wrongful overtaking.

One of the injured passengers receiving treatment at the hospital told journalists that the 14-seater Mitsubishi 300 bus was heading to EkwulfbEa from Amawbia.

He said the deceased were the driver and two passengers (a male and a

He said: "Soon after we took off from Amawbia, one of the passengers cautioned the driver against speeding, but he did not listen.

While trying to avoid a pothole, the driver lost control and the bus veered off the road, somersaulted and burst into flames after hitting the fence of a building by the roadside.

"I managed to escape with other passengers, but we could not assist the three victims who were already engulfed by the raging flames."

5 die, 8 injured in Lagos-Ibadan road accident

In Ogun State, five persons were con-firmed dead while eight others sustained injuries in an accident involving two vehicles at Fidiwo on the Lagos-Ibadan expressway vesterday

Mrs Florence Okpe, spokesperson, Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) in Ogun, who confirmed the Abeokuta incident to newsmen, explained that the accident occurred at 1.58 p.m and it involved a Mazda bus with number plate, FKY582YE, and a Mercedes Benztruck without number plate.

The FRSC spokesperson noted that the accident was caused by tyre burst and loss of control on the part of the truck which made it crash into the bus.

'A total of 15 people were involved in the accident, comprising eight men and seven women. Fight people were injured from the crash while five persons died." she said.

Okpe quoted the state Sector Commander, Anthony Uga, as advising motorists to pay more attention to their tyres and avoid the use of expired tyres.
