

Salome Adaidu: She was cheating, I don't regret killing her — Gospel singer

TIMILEYIN Ajayi, aged 32, who was caught with the severed head of Salome Adaidu, has said he does not regret killing her, as she was cheating on him with other men.

Meanwhile, Ajayi has been remanded in the Criminal Investigation Department, CID, of the Nasarawa State Police Command in Lafia, the Nasarawa State capital.

He told Channels TV: "I killed her because we don't have each other all the time. It's not something I planned. It happened on that day and it happened. Not that I have the plan in mind."

"She was cheating. She hid most of the things from me. I got to know from her phone. I saw her chats with other guys on the phone, that was why I decided."

"I don't have any regrets because life is reciprocal, that is what I thought. If you must do something to someone, you have to be reciprocal with that person."

"You have to understand what that person is going through, so that you can actually put yourself in the position that the person is going through. That is why I don't have any regret because we were actually compatible."

Adaidu, denied that any relationship existed between her deceased sister and the suspect, as she pleaded for justice.

She said: "This so-called Timiguy, we don't know him."

"We have never seen him until we were called up to tell us that this guy murdered

and dismembered our sister."

"I demand and need justice to be served to this guy sitting over there, because he is the one that murdered my sister and he confirmed it to me."

Salome's uncle, Samson Adaidu, spoke for the family: "The position of the family is

we discovered this through the Nigeria Police and we are expecting justice from the police."

"He has succeeded in destroying our daughter. Not ordinary killing, he butchered her into pieces. He cut that body into more than 50 pieces."

"And when you look at the whole thing, he is preparing that body for consumption because he cut them and left them in about six polythene bags."

There'll be justice — Police

Late Salome, aged 24, was a National Youth Service Corps, NYSC, member serving with Nikon Insurance in Abuja.

She had visited the suspect at his Papalana axis, New Karshi in Karu Local Government Area of Nasarawa State, residence.

The Police Public Relations Officer of the Nasarawa State Command, Ramhan Nansel, said: "Investigation is ongoing, and upon conclusion, he will be prosecuted in court."

Nansel said: "I want to assure the family and members of the public that this suspect will not be spared if found wanting."

"We are calling on members of the public, who may have any complaints against the suspect to come forward with their complaints and it will be looked into and investigated."
