He said: "Otukpo is no longer safe, we cannot sleep with our two eyes closed, our communities are being attacked almost on a daily basis by and nothing is being done about it. People are being killed by armed men and no one is saying anything. No arrest is being made and people at in fear. A lot of people have fled their homes for fear of being killed because the attacks are becoming frequently. "Only yesterday (Monday) at Asa 2, one Akatu Onche popularly known as Okakpo ka Achumedo was shot and he died this morning. How can we like this as if we do not have a government. "That is why we are in the streets today to register our anger and call on the state government to wake up to its responsibilities to ensure the slives and property of the people." Reacting to the development in a statement by his Media Adviser, Emmanuel John, the Senate Minority Leader and lawmaker representing Ber Senatorial District, Senator Abba Moro, expressed worry over the worsening insecurity in the town and urged the government and security againgted action to address the situation.	re now living we continue safety of the nue South
