Ekweremadu: Father of David Nwamini, boy involved in UK kidney transplant, dies

Nwamini, the boy at the centre of the alleged illegal kidney transplant saga involving former Deputy President of Nigeria's Senate, Ike Ekweremadu, is dead.

The deceased, Mr. Felix Nwamini Ukpo, died on Sunday, as confirmed by one of his sons and David's sibling, Boniface Nwamini Ukpo.

The son said that his father died due to shock from not seeing or speaking with Dayid since 2022 originated from Ekweremadu kidney saga.

In 2022, David was allegedly taken to the United Kingdom to donate his kidney to one of Ekweremadu's daughters, Sonia.

Ekweremadu, his wife, Beatrice, and his Doctor, Obinna Obeta, were later arrested after David had a change of heart and reported to the police. Ekweremadu, his wife, and the Doctor were later arrested and charged in court.

The trio was later convicted by a London court for trafficking the boy from Lagos to the United Kingdom to illegally harvest his kidney for a transplant for their seriously ill daughter.

The UK's Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) said in 2023 that Ike Ekweremadu had been sentenced to nine years and eight months in the UK's first illegal organ-harvesting prosecution, while his wife, Beatrice, 56, was sentenced to four years and six months.

Nigerian doctor Obinna Obeta, 51 – described by prosecutors as a middleman – was jailed for 10 years, the CPS said. All three were convicted in March 2023 for conspiring to arrange the travel of a man to harvest his organs.

Little has been heard from the family or David since then, until Monday, when one of the siblings, Boniface, spoke in Abakaliki, to confirm the death of the father.

He lamented that the pains and heartbreak the father had suffered over the son, David's travails, may have contributed to his death. He said the father had battled with the disappointment of not seeing his son for years.

Boniface further claimed that the family has not spoken with David since the incident happened in 2022.

Edeoga joins APC, gives reasons

FORMER Vice-Chancel lor of Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, Prof Hilary Edeoga, has joined the All Progressives Congress, APC, in Enuqu State.
